

Welcome to the Jack Lake Area Trails. The trail system is designed for hiking, biking, snowshoeing, and horseback riding.* Motor vehicles are prohibited on these trails.** The trail is on Langlade County property and is managed by the Langlade County Forestry and Recreation Dept. The trailhead is located within Langlade County's Veteran's Memorial Park.

TRAIL DESCRIPTION

The trail weaves its course through changing scenery of northern hardwood, aspen, and conifer forest types, which are typical of Langlade County. The trail also meanders along three undeveloped glacier lakes, wetlands, and bogs. The Langlade County Arboretum and Nature Trail including self-guided tours, marked plant species, and a boardwalk are within easy access of the Jack Lake Trail. The entire trail is clearly marked and consists of a combination of mowed grass, gravel, or hard-packed soil.

FACILITIES

The Jack Lake Area Trails are located within the Veteran's Memorial Park Recreation Complex. Facilities include: parking areas, restrooms, showers, drinking water access, park shelters, swimming beach, and rustic/RV camping. TIMBER HARVESTING

The Langlade County Forest is comprised of 127,000 acres and is managed for timber, wildlife, recreation, and other multiple use benefits. The northern hardwoods timber type is harvested using selective logging which provides continuous and sustainable forest products to society. The aspen type is

dependent upon full sunlight to regenerate itself which requires clearcutting to eliminate shade.

Other harvesting systems are also utilized dependent upon the specific needs of the individual forest stand.

You may encounter timber harvesting operations. **Please use caution and respect the logger's equipment as they earn their livelihood.**

OTHER TRAILS

The Jack Lake X-C Ski Trail is located one mile north of Veteran's Memorial Park. This premier ski trail consists of 9 loops with over 15 miles of groomed trails for all ability levels. In the off-season, the trail is open to all non-motorized activities.

Langlade County also offers more recreational trail opportunities such as: three more X-C ski trails, Ice Age Hiking Trails, hunter walking trails, horseback riding trails, mountain bike trails, road bike trails, sled dog trails, snowmobile trails, and ATV trails. 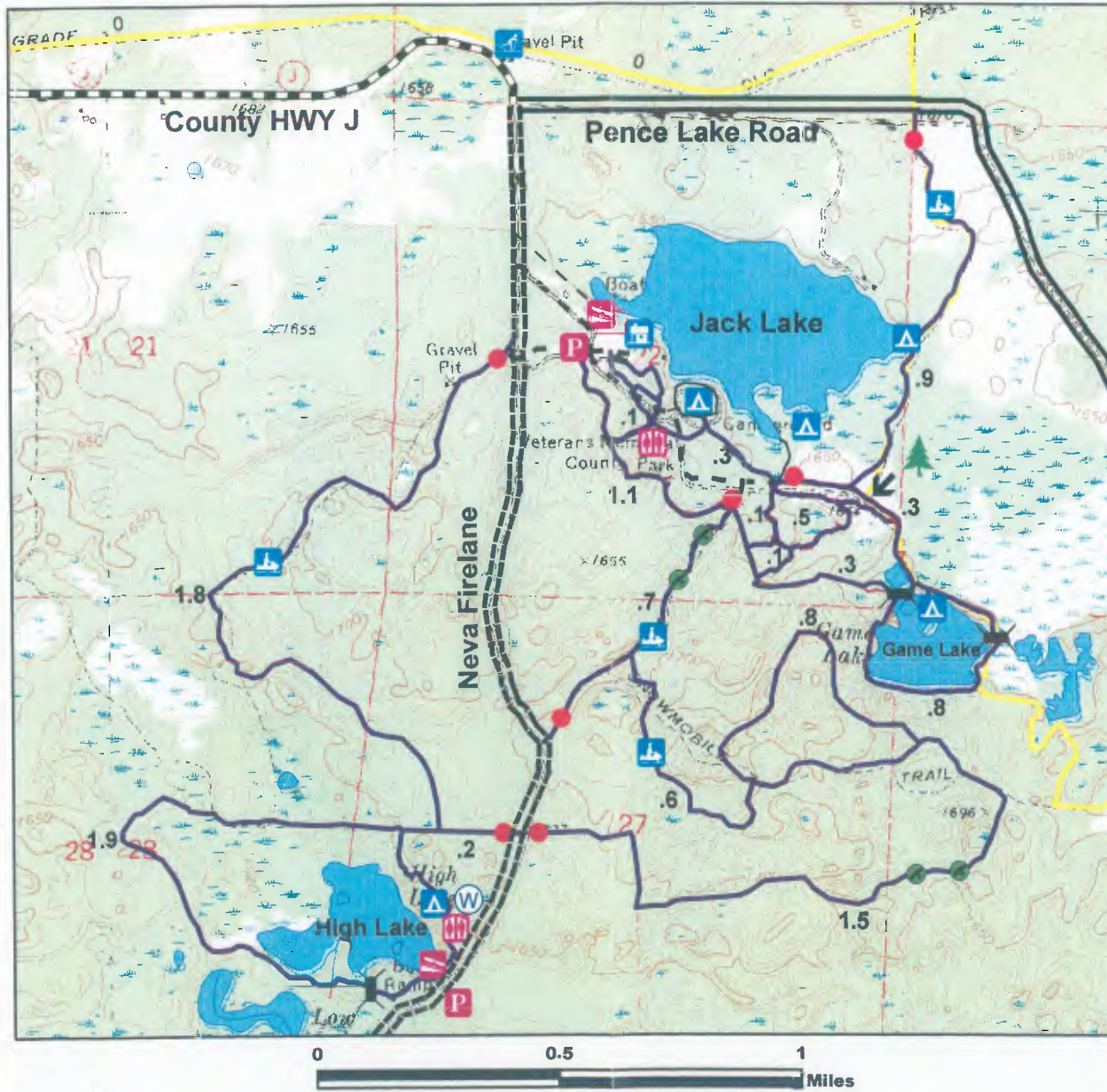

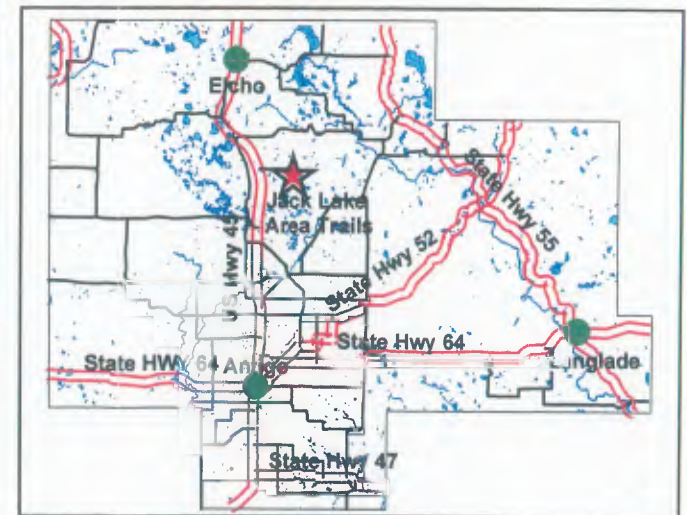
