

Welcome to Langlade County's Veteran's Memorial Park, located along beautiful Jack Lake- 15 miles north of Antigo, Wisconsin. Jack Lake is a pristine, crystal clear, spring-fed lake surrounded by hundreds of acres of country-owned forest, rich with recreational opportunities and wildlife. The park and campground are situated on the lake's west and south shore, nestled among mature maple, birch, oak and pine trees, providing a relaxing and peaceful setting.

Camping

Get ready to enjoy the Northwoods and smell the crackling fire! The campground is open from May 1 through December 1 and consists of 48 individual campsites with electrical hook-up. Campsites are \$20.00 per night. You may wish to call ahead since most sites are booked on a first come-first serve basis. A few sites are reservable (see map) Call Park Manager 715-623-6214 for reservation info.

Amenities include a newly constructed flush toilet and shower facility, firewood sales, ice sales, boat rentals, picnic tables, fire rings, playground equipment, volleyball and basketball courts, horseshoe pits, a pay phone and a RV dumping station.

Group Camping Sites - If you are looking for more privacy and seclusion, check out the three group sites available for reservation.

Snow Shelter - This group site has a fire pit, outhouse, small shelter and picnic tables.

South Shore (located on the lake) - This group site has a volleyball net, horseshoe pit, fire pit, picnic tables, large open grassy area and pit toilets.

The Deer Camp - This group site is designed for tent or truck campers. It features a fire ring, picnic tables, mature trees for privacy and shade, and a short path that leads to flush toilets and showers.

These sites are non-electric. Fees for group sites are based on 3 camping units at a price of \$15.00 per unit. Group sites can be reserved by calling the Park Manager at 715-623-6214. Reservations are accepted starting the first working day after New Year's Day.

New Cabin Sites

Rustic Cabins - Our cabins are perfect for people who like a little more protection from the elements or don't own camping gear. The cabins are reservable, and are \$50.00 per night with a two night minimum on weekends. There is electricity, but no running water. Drinking water is close by and flush toilets and shower are a short walk.

Timberdoodle Lodge & Ruffed Grouse Retreat - These newly constructed 16 x 20 cabins sleep five and features bunk beds, dining table, chairs, grill, fire pit and gas fireplace.

Primitive Hike-In/ Boat-In Campsites

- For the more rugged camper, check one of our primitive sites.

The Game Lake Campsite is located on the undeveloped Game Lake. This campsite is nestled among towering pines and is accessible only by the Game Lake Nature Trail. This site includes a fire ring, picnic tables, canoe and stacked firewood.

Loon Cry Outpost is located on the East shore of Jack Lake. It is accessible by boat or hiking trail. This site includes picnic tables, fire ring, stacked firewood, total seclusion and your own sandy beach.

High Lake Wilderness Camping Area is located on the undeveloped High Lake, 1 mile South of Veteran's Memorial Park. All 8 sites are accessible by hiking or boat only. Amenities include picnic tables, fire rings, drinking water, pit toilets and firewood sales.

Primitive campsites are \$15.00 per night.

Loon Cry and Game Lake Sites are reservable.

The park also has a handicap accessible fishing pier and beach.

Campground and Park Rules

1. You must register before setting up your camping unit.
2. After registration, you must put your camping unit on the site before you leave the park.
3. No one under 18 years of age may register for a site, and someone over 18 years old must be on site with minor children.
4. Limit eight people per site and one unit per site.
5. Quiet time from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
6. No visitors in park or campground from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
7. No more than two vehicles per campsite.
8. No fireworks.
9. Check-out time is 1:00 p.m. You must check-out at the office or drop your camping stub in the check-out box once you have completely vacated your site.
10. If you have not re-registered your site for another night by 1:00 p.m. on the day you're registered to leave, your site will be registered to another party, regardless if you have moved your equipment off the site. If camping equipment is left after check-out time, it will be considered abandoned property and Langlade County may assume ownership.
11. No dogs allowed in the park and must be on a leash in the campground. Dogs may not be left unattended at any time.
12. Parties causing disturbances or violating any rules, can or will be evicted by the sheriff's department or park manager, and are subject to a fine or disorderly conduct charges, loss of site, and no refund for money paid.
13. Bringing your own firewood is prohibited.

WATER ACTIVITIES - Jack Lake's clean, clear water and its 'no motors' designation make it ideal for swimming and canoeing. You'll enjoy calm, safe and uncrowded waters with a sandy beach! Jack Lake is also a great place to wet a line. Fisherman enjoy excellent populations of bass, trout, and panfish. The park offers a public boat landing, boat rentals, fishing bait sales and several piers for the shore fisherman. (Remember the operation of outboard motors is prohibited; however, electric motors are legal.)

HIKING/BIKING - Outdoor enthusiasts will find many miles of scenic trails to explore which are easily accessible from Veteran's Memorial Park. The Game Lake Nature Trail meanders through several forest habitats, crosses a floating bog and circles a wilderness lake. The trail is well marked and has several access points so hiking distances can vary. The Langle County Arboretum joins with the nature trail and host a variety of native plants for easy viewing. Bikers can ride on the Game Lake Nature Trail or explore the countless forest roads. In addition, the Ice Age National Scenic Trail is easily accessible from the park. Please request a trail guide from the Park Manager.

DISC GOLF - This challenging 18-hole course features a variety of terrain including open park lands, woods, and lake shore. Discs, supplies and refreshments are available at the Pro Shop located in the office.

SHELTERS - The park has three shelters marked A, B & C which are available for private parties. Please see the park map. The shelters have electricity and can be reserved by calling the Park Manager at 715-623-6214. The cost is \$50.00 per day. No pets are allowed in the park.

WINTER ACTIVITIES - The park is a trail head for snowmobiling with access to over 500 miles of groomed trails. Ample parking is available. The Game Lake Nature Trail serves as a challenging snowshoe trail. The Jack Lake Cross Country Ski Trail consists of 10 groomed loops totaling nearly 20 miles designed for the beginner and expert alike.
