1 Scan this QR code with your phone's camera. Click the link that pops up and follow the instructions to install the app and create an account!



2 Scroll down to “Historic Tours and Local Stories”, double-tap “Historic Downtown Antigo Walking Tour”, and then tap “Explore”.

3 Turn your volume up or wear earbuds, then start walking towards any of the pins on the map! Audio narrations will automatically play as you get near to them!

Langlade County Historical Society Museum



404 Superior Street | Funded by a Carnegie Foundation grant, it was designed by Alan Conover, a prominent Wisconsin architect, and built as a public library in 1905. It is one of the few Carnegie libraries still in existence.

Deeglise Cabin



404 Superior Street | The first home built in Antigo, by founder Francis Deeglise. It was built in 1878 on the bank of Springbrook, then moved to the library (museum) grounds in 1914. Tours available.

440 Locomotive & Caboose



404 Superior Street | A Baldwin 2-8-0 "Consolidated"-class steam locomotive built in the early 20th century, connected to a tender and caboose from later decades. Tours available.

Antigo Normal School



411 Superior Street | Built as a teachers' college in 1925, featuring a gymnasium, auditorium, and several classrooms. It now hosts the Boys & Girls Club of the Northwoods.

Antigo Post Office



501 Clermont Street | An ornate example of pre-Depression federal architecture, this building has served as Antigo's post office since it was built in 1915 and remains mostly unchanged from its original construction.

Antigo Train Depot



524 Morse Street | The last remaining structure from Antigo's railroad heyday, this apartment building, built in 1905, was once the bustling train depot for the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad Company in Antigo.

Veterans' Mural



710 Fifth Avenue | This mural by Brian Ponshock salutes Antigo's many veterans throughout history, ranging from the Civil War to modern conflicts.

Horseracing Mural



707 Fifth Avenue | Designed and painted by local artists in 2022, this mural pays homage to Antigo's rich history as a center of horseracing and home to Kentucky Derby Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas.

Langlade County Courthouse



800 Clermont Street | Built in 1905, the courthouse features murals by Swedish artist Axel E. Soderberg and was designed by the firm Kinney & Detweiler, known for other courthouses throughout the country.
