

Welcome to the Langlade County hunter walking trails. These trails are located entirely on Langlade County Forest northeast of Antigo and lie in between County Highway T and the Camp 23 road. Over 24 miles of trails are mowed and maintained annually. Trails are managed by the Langlade County Forestry Department in cooperation with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

### *Trail Description*

The area where the trails are located consists primarily of aspen forests with intermixed hardwood ridges and swamps. Trails are primarily forest roads that have been widened and are mowed annually. Topography is rolling and trail difficulty is moderate. Motor vehicle traffic is prohibited and all trails are gated or blocked.

### *Access*

Access is good and parking is available off of CTH T. Jack Lake Firelane, Camp 23 Road, and Stevens Springs Grade are low maintenance roads but are in good shape and provide good access for all types of vehicles. Ample parking opportunities exist at trailheads.

### *Habitat Management*

Forest management in this block of county land is focused on creating ideal habitat for white-tailed deer, ruffed grouse, American woodcock, and other “young forest” wildlife species. This is primarily done through clearcutting aspen which results in dense thickets that provide wildlife with food and cover. Harvest timing, shape, and size are all carefully planned to promote aspen age class diversity, which greatly improves habitat. After harvests are complete, landings and roads are seeded to clover.



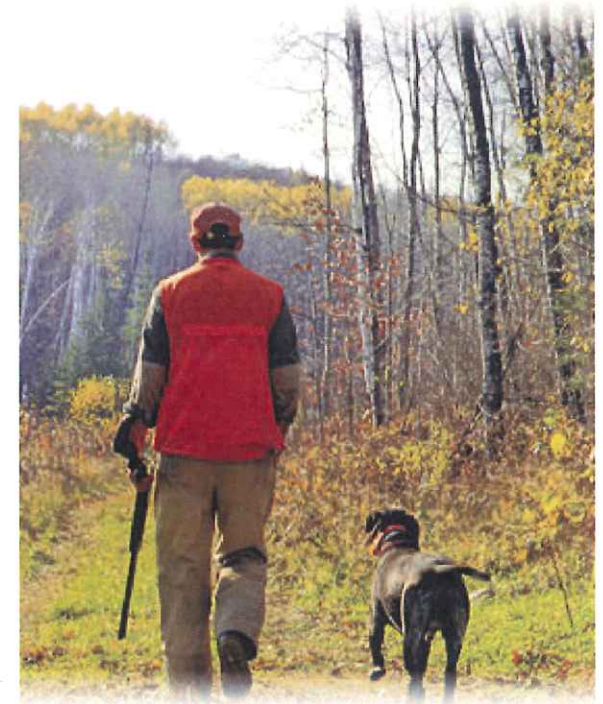
### *Donations*
