



PERCH LAKE CAMPGROUND POLICIES

Season: Perch Lake Campground is open from mid-May to mid-October (weather permitting).

Visitor Hours: 8:00 am – 10:00 pm, visitors cannot park at your site if there are already two vehicles on the site.

Quiet Hours: 10:00 pm – 8:00 am. Radios and generators off (unless required medically); quiet conversations only. Children under 18 must be on their site and under adult supervision. No camping party shall start setting up or taking down their camping unit during these times. No ATV or UTV travel during quiet hours within the campground. Generators required for medical reasons may be allowed but those generators must maintain noise levels under 60 decibels measured directly at the generator. Most inverter generators such as those build by Honda and Champion will meet these requirements.

Generators for Recharging of Batteries: Operating a motorized electric generating plant **that exceeds a noise level of 60 decibels** measured on the A-weighted scale at 50 feet is only authorized from 1:00 pm until 4:00 pm of each day of reservations to recharge batteries. Operation of a generator that produces a noise level **less than 60 decibels** measured on A-weighted scale at 50 feet is only authorized between 11:00 am – 7:00 pm of each day to recharge batteries.

Generators for Medical Purposes: Those generators that produce noise levels **under 60 decibels** measured directly at the generator may be operated as needed for medical reasons (oxygen production, medical monitors) but should be limited to times when battery capacity is depleted or capacity is uncertain. Most inverter generators such as those build by Honda and Champion will meet these requirements.

Check-Out/In Times: Check-in time is 3:00 pm and check-out is 12:00 pm daily.

One Camping Unit per Site: Unless designated as a double or group site, only one camping unit/one household allowed per site. Camping units are considered to be one camper, one RV, or one large tent. Screen tents and tents for minor children are permissible in addition to the main camping unit. Group and double sites require multiple registrations for each unit present.

Campsite Occupancy: Unless designated as a double or group site, only one household per site and maximum of 8 people per site. Adults must be present when minors are on site.

ATV/UTV Traffic: ATV's and UTV's are authorized on the campgrounds strictly for access to and from campsites. Use of ATV's and UTV's for joyriding or other uses around the campground or within the park area is not allowed. All ATV and UTV traffic must travel at a speed less than 10 miles per hour and must adhere to Quiet Hour rules.



Vehicles: Two vehicles are allowed per site, this may include a combination of cars, trucks, ATV's and UTV's, no exceptions! Additional vehicles and cargo trailers are required to park in the overflow parking area.

Pets: Pets are welcome in the campground. They must remain on a leash no longer than 8 ft. and under control/attended by owners at all times. Please pick up after your pet. Pets are not allowed in the designated park area or in any public building.

Campfires: Campfires are only allowed in established fire rings. No garbage in fire pits and no moving of fire rings. Upon arrival, if your campsite and/or fire ring are filled with garbage, please notify the campground office immediately or you will be held responsible.

Fireworks and Firearms: Prohibited at all times!

Personal Conduct: No person shall engage in violent, abusive, indecent, profane, boisterous, unreasonably loud or otherwise disorderly conduct. Complaints received may lead to eviction of site immediately by Campground Staff or Sheriff's Department and possible fines for violations.

Campsite Responsibility: Adults reserving and/or registering for a site will be held responsible for any violations occurring on that site, including violations caused by non-registered guests/party members. If you reserved a site for others and did not provide their contact information, the name on the reservation will be charged for any violations. You are responsible for cleaning up your litter and animal waste!

Firewood: Wood is available for purchase for \$5/bundle. You may bring in wood that is purchased through a local, certified vendor or within Langlade County limits. Construction lumber free of nails or hardware is allowed. All other wood will be confiscated. No defacing, cutting, or removing trees, brush or firewood from lands owned by Langlade County. Exceptions include gathering dead sticks or branches from the forest floor for kindling. Violators will be subject to fines associated with timber theft.

RV Dump Station: The RV dump station is free of charge for registered campers only. Non-registered campers can utilize our dump station for a \$15 fee. All trash must be hauled out and deposited into dumpsters. Dumpsters are available for registered campers only.

Wildlife: Keep Wildlife wild! There will be wildlife present, please do not disturb, harass or feed them. We also advise not to keep trash or food out overnight or you may get an unexpected visitor! If you spot what appears to be an "abandoned" animal, please leave it alone and the mother will most likely come back to get it after you leave.



Registration Policies/Procedures

Reservations: Expected opening of the Campground in early to mid June will be first come first serve until July 1, 2023. Beginning July 1, 2023 Reservations are 100% online. Reservations must be made at least 7 days in advance from desired check-in date. Up to four sites can be reserved per transaction. Please call ahead if you are interested in an early check-in. Checking-out is not necessary for reservations. After the close of the 2023 season, reservations will begin the first business day after the New Year at 8:30 am. Reservation dates will run from Memorial Day weekend to mid-October. Reservations must be made at least 7 days in advance from desired check-in date. Up to four sites can be reserved per transaction. Please call ahead if you are interested in an early check-in. Checking-out is not necessary for reservations.

Payment Methods: Reservations require full payment at the time of booking with either a credit or debit card. On-site registrations or vending purchases require full payment at the time of registration with either cash or checks payable to Langlade County Treasurer.

Cancellations: If you choose to cancel your reservation, cancellations must be at least 10 days in advance from your check-in date. Refunds for cancellations will be in the form of a credit code that will be automatically applied to your online account for future reservations made, no cash refunds will be issued. If you choose to cancel less than 10 days of your check-in date, you will forfeit your full payment. We cannot give refunds. You are able to edit and cancel your reservations yourself!

Maximum Stay: 14 nights. Thereafter, camping party and camping unit must leave the campground for one day.

How to Register for a Vacant Site:

Sites are considered vacant **when not reserved through the on-line reservation system** (marked with a current tag on the campsite post) and when there is not a camping unit present. Green reservation tags will be present for future dates, do not remove. No campsite is open for camping until previous camping party has vacated. Occupancy of a site reserved by other parties will result in immediate removal of parties that improperly utilize sites without prior reservations. Presence of a previous camping party after times reserved will result in County removal of all items present. Under County ordinance, items present on a site without reservation becomes property of the County.

Campers must follow all registration procedures below or they may lose their site:

1. Check on-line registration at langladeforestryandparks.com for unreserved sites, grab a self-registration slip from registration station and drive around campground to find a vacant site without a tag on the campsite post or check with camp host for availability of sites.



2. Once you have selected a site, please completely fill out the registration slip, place your full payment inside the envelope, tear off the tag and place envelope into payment deposit box.
3. Please be aware of any upcoming reservation dates (listed on green tags on camp post) before setting up camp. You will be required to vacate sites for prior reservations.
4. Place your self-registration tag on your camp post and place a camping tent, camper or motor vehicle on your site immediately. Children's play tents or hunting blinds, boats, coolers, lawn chairs, tarps, etc. are not appropriate camping units.
